# 1. Introduction

JoomRoadmap is a powerful Joomla 2.5 extension for managing and presentation of projects and their versions and tasks. For each project an unlimited versions can be set. Behind each version several tasks can be set including task names, progress (in %) and a planned duration.

## 2. Installation

The Installation has to be done with the integrated Joomla component installation feature.

## 3. Funtions and operations

### 1. Main menu

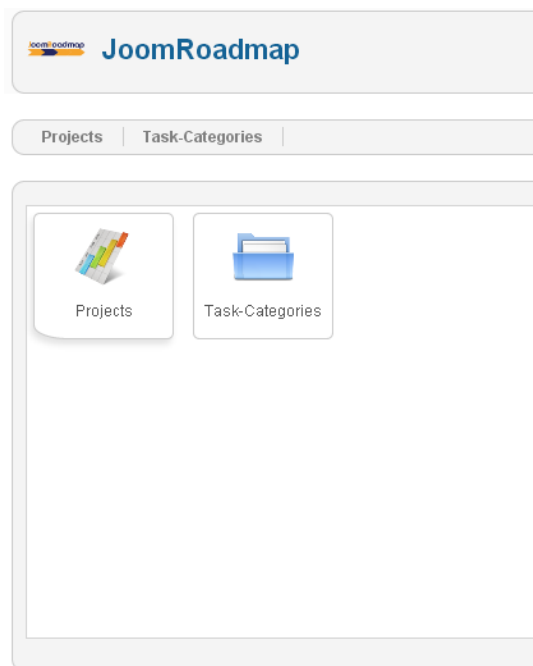


Figure 1 - Main menu

On the main screen two buttons are displayed. The “projects” button and the “task categories” button.

- State (publish / unpublish)
- ID

### Create / Edit Project



### 3. Version Management


Figure 5 – Version overview

- Name of the version
- Version status (Planned, Released, Canceled)
- Release date
- Progress (calculated automatically by all tasks of this version - %)
- State (publish / unpublish)

By clicking on the version name, the user can edit the selected version.


The following information can be set for each task:

- Selection of the version which should be assigned to this task
- Task title
- Processing state (Open, In Process, Reopened, Done)
- Category name (see next chapter)
- Planned duration (in hours)
- Progress (in %)
- Description

**Note: The progress in progress bar in the frontend will be shown only in the state “In Process”. If “Done” is selected it always shows 100%. If “Open” state is selected it always shows “0%”.**

## 5. Task categories

The user can set different task categories (e.g. Backend Feature, Frontend feature, etc.).

## 4. Frontend view

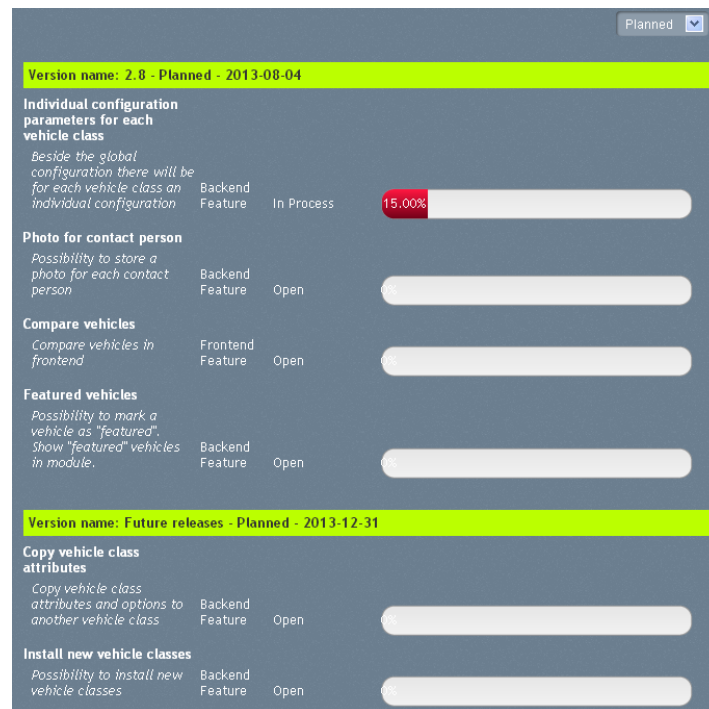


Figure 10 – Frontend view (example)

There are 2 options available.

1. Project  
If you select project, you can set which project should be shown. By clicking on the menu item the visitor gets all versions including the assigned tasks.
2. Projects  
If you select this, the visitor gets a list of all available projects. By clicking on a specific project the visitor gets the same view than under the project menu item.
